On Sunday October 31, 2004, I had the pleasure of attending the Mass at MCAS Miramar. We presented the base Chaplain 53,340 religious Christmas Cards for the troops in the Middle East to send to their families. Many thanks to those

Councils, Assemblies, Circles, Insurance Agencies and individual brother Knights who participated. Forty hours after we turned over the cards they were on the tarmac in Baghdad.

We had a great parade on Veteran's Day. We had more Knights than we had flags to carry.

The Council in Palm Springs and Twenty-Nine Palms presented 133 candidates for the 3<sup>rd</sup> degree. The degree was dedicated to Brother John F. Moore for years of service, dedicated loyalty to the Knights of Columbus. John traveled extensively throughout the State of California with his flag display where the story of the American Flag is told to students, civic groups and historians. Last year, John's flag display was taken to Washington DC for display as requested by Supreme Knight Carl Anderson. #### **PCP Joe Proctor – Membership:**

Thank you to all who are involved in membership efforts. We have contacted 656 individuals from throughout the county asking them to join the Knights of Columbus. We have successfully brought in 231 candidates to the First Degree. The Form 100s must be processed and mailed to Supreme Office in a timely manner. We are leading the State in all areas of membership except, bringing back prior members. We need each council to contact their prior members and ask them to return. We now need to prepare for the Jan 23, 2005 Membership Drive. Know the date you are actually going to conduct your drive. If you cannot do it on the Jan. 23<sup>rd</sup> tell me the date you will hold it. If you are holding your first

membership drive in January, you are behind the rest of us. We have two districts that have not recruited one new member. I personally feel there is something wrong there.

#### **PCP Larry Campitiello – MR Drive:**

Only 15 councils have turned in their money. I urge you to send in your funds as quickly as possible. On a sad note, Don Morgan, Vice President of the Columbian Foundation had his leg amputated and is quite seriously ill. Greetings from St. John Seminary in Camarillo. I hope this letter finds you well. I am happy to report that my second year in theology is in full swing. I am taking a full class load that includes the following classes:

- Synoptic Gospels w/ Methodology
- Church History: 1500 to Present
- Contemporary Preaching
- Liturgy and Culture
- Christology and Trinity
- Christology of Karl Rahner and Urs Von Balthasar (both German theologians)

Prior to beginning the new academic year, I had the opportunity for some pastoral experience over the summer at St. Mary Parish in El Centro. Boy was it hot in the Imperial County. Whew! Afterwards, my classmates (16 of us) from Camarillo and I went on a month-long retreat at the Mary and Joseph retreat house in Rancho Palos Verdes in L.A. This retreat was called the IPSF (Intense Period of Spiritual Formation) that included one week of silence. That was difficult to do given that half of my classmates are extroverts. However, before that week was over we embraced the silence for it became a wonderful way to listen to God's voice. .

Each year, a class receives a particular ministry. Since last year was my first year here, I received the Ministry of Candidacy. This Saturday October 16th I will be receiving the Ministry of Reader (Lector) and on March 12th; I will be receiving the Ministry of Acolyte. The reason 2nd year students receive two ministries in the year is because next year we are on internship at a parish in our home diocese.

I think I speak for all San Diego seminarians when I say that it is a wonderful time for vocations in our diocese for on June 3rd five men will be ordained to the priesthood. The following year three are scheduled for ordination and then in May 2007 just me. Please continue to pray for us. Just as the spiritual journey is filled with blessings it is equally filled with challenges.

We give rosaries and scapulars free of charge to school children, our servicemen, veterans hospitals, the blind, leper colonies, inmates in prisons and missionaries all over the world. We now service 56 prisons and have a directory listing 450 more prisons in the United States.

In the United States, the national average for paroled inmates being returned to prison is 80%. Of those inmates who find God, only 10% return.

We shipped, without charge, 263,000 rosaries and 51,800 scapulars, also eight truck loads of books to nearby prisons. These included as many bibles as we could afford, plus 1,300,000 pieces of printed literature in English, Spanish and Italian.

We are now making and laminating our own brown and green scapulars. Our goal is to make and distribute 40,000 brown and green scapulars a year.

We are all unpaid volunteers. Our founder furnishes the site for our facilities and pays all utilities. 94% of all donations goes directly to our program. We will be happy to send you a financial statement if you so desire.

All of these operations are run by volunteers. At the present time we are in need of:

- Person to print
- Pack shipments
- Take shipments to the Post Office
- Make scapulars
- Cut printed papers (on a commercial paper cutter)
- Unpack shipments of donated Rosaries
- Keep records of rosary donations and shipments
- Convert semi-metal Rosaries to full metal Rosaries  
by changing the plastic cross and center to metal

Volunteers come to our shop on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. These activities are accomplished in a two and a half stall garage that has been converted into an office environment. Our shop has cooling and heating equipment making it always comfortable for our volunteers. All of these activities can be accomplished in the home. Perhaps some wives would also like to help us as we are in need of typists with computers.

At this time, John and Linda Giltner, and Fred DiCarlo are volunteers from the KCs. Bill and Mary Banner had to drop out due to health reasons. It would be greatly appreciated if your members would bring our appeal home to their wives.

In 1918 Our Lord appeared to Sister Josefa Menendez of the Society of the Sacred Heart of Jesus with the instructions to write the book, "The Way of Divine Love". Throughout this entire 500 page book Jesus' main request was to save souls. How can any of us refuse his request?

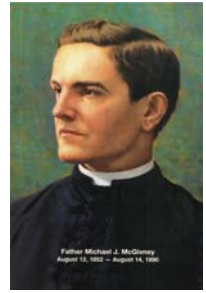

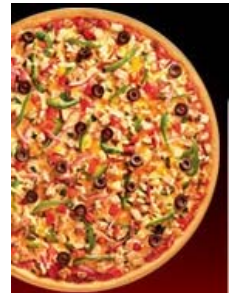
